The fifth largest country in the world, Brazil's outstanding natural beauty is a perfect backdrop for the joyous celebration of life that is so characteristic of its people. In a dazzling country of pristine beaches, steamy tropical jungles and bustling cities, music and

dancing are as integral to life as a great meal and a siesta. Skirted by 5,000 miles of palm-fringed coastline, the interior of Brazil is a wilderness of rainforests and wetlands teeming with exotic flora and fauna, through which flows the mighty Amazon River. This waterway endows the country with some of the world's most awe-inspiring natural phenomena, from majestic waterfalls to the rich diversity of life in the Amazon Rainforest. Some of the oldest cities and the latest architecture co-exist alongside well-preserved colonial towns with cobbled streets. Brazil's diverse population is a melting pot of three main ethnic groups comprising the indigenous natives of Brazil, European settlers and the descendants of Africans.

Whether it is fine dining or street food, Brazilian cuisine offers a considerable variety. 'Feijoada', considered the national dish, is a stew of black beans and various meats often washed down with 'caipirinha', a potent drink of lime and sugarcane liquor. 'Churrasco', are a variety of charcoal grilled meats served at local steakhouses called 'churrascarias'






Well-known for their music, Brazilian artistes play everything from rap, funk, jazz and rock to regional rhythms such as the swinging afro-axé pop in Salvador and the fast maracatu in the north-east. Brazil's pursuit of the good life finds uninhibited expression in numerous bars, taverns and nightclubs in all its major cities. While the legendary Carnival is a non-stop party like no other, some other noteworthy celebrations include Reveillon, the New Year's celebration at Rio de



Janeiro, the Passion Play leading to Easter at Recife in north-eastern Brazil, the Celebration of Yemanjá, Goddess of the Sea in Salvador and the Sao Paulo Bienal, Latin America's biggest arts event. Much of modern Brazil's appeal is derived from its mix of the old and the new, from its reverence for tradition and its enthusiasm for the avant-garde in all aspects of life from architecture and culture to technology and business attitudes.

Day 1: Sao Paulo — Rio de Janeiro (by air)

Arrive at Sao Paulo International Airport and connect to your onward flight to Rio de Janeiro. On arrival transfer to your hotel for an overnight stay in Rio de Janeiro.

Dav 2: Rio de Janeiro

Visit Corcovado Mountain to see the famous statue of Christ made of soapstone mosaic and drive along Rio's famous beaches. Overnight in Rio de Janeiro.

Day 3: Rio de Janeiro

In the evening take a tour to Sugar Loaf Mountain with a cable car ride for stunning views and dinner at a barbecue restaurant. Overnight in Rio de Janeiro.

Day 4: Rio de Janeiro — Iguaçu Falls (by air)

Start the morning with a walking tour that descends into a canyon, offering a panoramic view of more than 240 falls. Take the glass elevator up the cliff face for fabulous views. Overnight in Iguaçu.

Day 5: Iquacu Falls

Visit the Argentinean side of the falls, cross the Tancredo Neves Bridge en route to the Iguaçu National Park. After a train ride through the park, we go on a walking tour and see the suspended platform at the brink of Devil's Throat – the largest of the waterfalls. Overnight in Iguaçu.

Day 6: Iguaçu Falls — Manaus (by air)

Transfer to Iguaçu Airport for a flight to Manaus via Sao Paulo and proceed to your hotel. Overnight in Manaus.

Day 7: Manaus — Amazon

After a city tour of Manaus, visit the Amazon Rainforest. Depart in a motorised canoe with a guide, in search for alligators called "caimans". Overnight in the Amazon.

Day 8: Amazon

Start the day with a nature hike and after lunch depart on a motorised canoe with a guide to observe Piranha fish and learn about the lives of native Indian inhabitants. Overnight in the Amazon.

Day 9: Amazon — Manaus — Salvador (by air)

Visit a monkey jungle reserve and transfer back to the Manaus tropical pier by boat, followed by a transfer to Manaus Airport for your flight to Salvador via Brasilia for your overnight stay.

Day 10: Salvador

Enjoy a half-day tour of historical Bahia. In the evening enjoy the Bahia by night tour and a typical Bahian show. Overnight in Salvador.

Day 11: Salvador

Spend this day at leisure with optional tours such as a full-day schooner cruise with lunch or a full-day trip to the city of Cachoeira. Overnight in Salvador.

Day 12: Salvador - Sao Paulo (by air)

Transfer from your hotel to the airport for your flight to Sao Paulo. Overnight in Sao Paulo.

Day 13: Sao Paulo

This day is free for you to enjoy at your own leisure and pace.

Day 14: Sao Paulo

Transfer to Sao Paulo International Airport for your return flight.

Sao Paulo is a city like no other. The largest metropolis in Latin America and the world's third largest city, Sao Paulo overwhelms the senses with its sheer size. With over 19 million inhabitants, its attraction lies in its people and its vibrant culture. It is Brazil's most modern and cosmopolitan city that is a veritable melting pot of nationalities. Avenida Paulista's skyscrapers are a testimony to the city's energy and rich artistic heritage. The city is famed for its outstanding cuisines, entertainment and nightlife and museums that are among the finest in South America. In recent years, the city has evolved into a centre for Brazil's own martial art – capoeira, in which dance-like motions are performed to music. A Brazilian vanguard and cultural centre, Sao Paulo must first be known and discovered to be cherished. It then, becomes impossible to forget.

Best buys: Shops and boutiques in the area of Jardin, ceramics and jewellery.



This full-day excursion takes you to one of Brazil's, indeed one of the world's greatest natural wonders. During the day, huge rainbows arc over the 275 cascades that make up the falls, which pour some 390,000 cubic metres of water a minute and drop from as high as 80 metres at the point where the **Iguaçu River** is around 2,700 metres wide.

We pick you up from your hotel and take you to Sao Paulo Airport for the flight to **Iguaçu Falls,** where you will be driven to the **Argentinean** side of the falls.

After a quick customs check, cross the **Tancredo Neves Bridge** over the **Iguaçu River**, which forms the border between Argentina and Brazil. Once in Argentina, you take the scenic highway up to the **Argentine Iguaçu Park**



and board a train before arriving at the upper walkways, which get you close to the falls, the rainforest and the suspended platform at the very brink of Devil's Throat the largest of the waterfalls. You also visit San Martin Falls. Later if weather and time allow, we stop briefly at the Three Borders point. where the Paraná and Iquacu Rivers. as well as the borders of Brazil, Argentina and Paraguay, meet. We then stop for



lunch at a local restaurant for an authentic Brazilian barbecue.

After lunch, return across the border to the **Brazilian Falls** and the **National Iguaçu Park** and drive through lush sub-tropical vegetation en route to the falls. Stroll along a trail descending into a canyon that offers panoramic views of more than 240 falls before taking a glass elevator up the cliff face for a view from the upper deck.

After your visit, we transfer you to Iguaçu Airport for your flight to Sao Paulo. On arrival in Sao Paulo we drop you to your hotel.

This excursion is by air and coach, includes airport transfers, English-speaking guide and lunch. Entrance ticket to Iguaçu National Park is not included and is charged separately.

Sao Paulo is a city of superlatives – the third largest city in the world, the largest in the southern hemisphere and the foremost industrial and business centre in Latin America.

Our comprehensive excursion provides an excellent introduction to the city and its neighbourhoods. We take you to the residential areas of **Higienópolis** with its 1950's apartment buildings, **Pacaembu Soccer Stadium** and the **School of Medicine** before heading to **Morumbi Hill** for sweeping views across the city and the **Jardim** residential district.

We continue to **Ibirapuera Park** with its beautiful gardens and lakes. At the entrance to the park, visitors will admire Sao Paulo's iconic monument, **Bandeirantes** – homage to the first settlers who expanded Portuguese America from small coastal enclaves to roughly the same territory as current Brazil. To the left of the monument is the **Chamber of Deputies** building and **Obelisco Do Ibirapuera**. The park is also the site of the city's **Planetarium**, the **Contemporary Art Museum** and the **Sao Paulo Biannual Art Exposition**.

We then visit the Japanese district, **Sao Paulo's Cathedral**, the bustling downtown and for shoppers, elite **Oscar Freire Street**, with its sophisticated restaurants, fashion shops, jewellers, chic cafés and art galleries.

This excursion operates daily and includes pick-up and drop-off from your hotel and English-speaking driver.








Rio de Janeiro is a city of beauty and contrasts – contrasts of colour, lifestyles and dazzling scenery that will always fascinate and make one long to be there. It is one of the largest cities in South America widely renowned for its various cultural celebrations. Rio de Janeiro is a city sculptured on a thin strip of land between the mountains and the sea. It is renowned for its spectacular

Rio also boasts the world's largest forest inside an urban area, Tijuca Forest.








This full-day private excursion will take you to all the highlights of Rio de Janeiro. In the morning we drive to the Lagoa Rodrigo de Freitas (lagoon) after which you arrive at the Rebouças tunnel. This 2.6 kilometre long complex tunnel links the southern and northern parts of the city separated by the Tijuca National Forest making Rio the only city in the world to have a National Park five minutes from downtown.

After arriving at the **Cosme Velho district**, a Swiss-made cogwheel train takes you up the **Corcovado Mountain** from its base at 15 metres to its summit at 670 metres. The mountain has been

Rio's top attraction and has been widely praised by famous Brazilian composers. Reach the peak by climbing a flight of steps to the base of **Christ the Redeemer statue.** This statue covered with a mosaic of






soapstone, is one of Rio's finest Art Nouveau monuments and has recently been proclaimed as one of the New Seven Wonders of the World. From this vantage point you can view the surrounding **Tijuca Park** below along with a circle of mountains closing the horizon at the very back of the **Guanabara Bay**. On the way back, you will pass through the downtown area and **Edson Passos Avenue**. Descending into **Barra da Tijuca** you will stop for lunch at one of the few fine barbecue restaurants.


After lunch, drive past the famous beaches and visit **Sugar Loaf Mountain,** known world over as Rio's postcard and a must-see. You will arrive here in the afternoon which is the best time to enjoy the view. Sugar Loaf Mountain is reached by a two-stage cable car ride accommodating up to 50 people per trip. Each stage is a two-minute ride. The first stage, **Morro da Urca** is barely 170 metres high and has a restaurant, amphitheatre, a heliport for scenic rides and a privileged view of the Yacht Club and **Botafogo Bay.** The second stage takes you up to Sugar Loaf, named because of the loaves of sugar that were commonly used by the Portuguese at the time of the discovery of the city. Take in the unrivaled all-encompassing view of this privileged 270-metre high lookout before returning to your hotel.

The city of Petrópolis was originally a farm where the imperial family of Brazil built its summer residence during the 19th century. Even after the abdication of Emperor D. Pedro II of Brazil, the city retained its glory, maintaining the status of the summer residence of the President of the Republic. Petrópolis is a fine mountain resort city, famous for its museum, with a good selection of imperial times memorabilia and many cultural activities. It is also well-known for the manufacture of sports and knitwear at reasonable prices.







After visiting the Cathedral, other monuments and historic sites dating back from the late 19th and early 20th centuries, you will stop for lunch at Chale Manaka restaurant. This restaurant is a private residence built in Baroque style where the owners of the house welcome you. Here, enjoy

a Brazilian buffet lunch. After lunch, visit the Imperial Museum and Quitandinha which was built to be the largest casino hotel in South America. Nowadays it is a place for conventions and events. Its ballrooms in Hollywood style from the 40's are open to the public. The Imperial Museum displays the crown jewels as well as antiques and documents from Emperor Pedro II's period. Here you will have time for shopping and bargain hunting. Return to Rio after exploring the museum.



One of the world's most enchanting cities, Salvador da Bahia, was the capital of Portugal's western empire until the 18th century as well as the largest port in the Americas. Its wealth was created by Bahia's fertile land and the import of slaves from Africa. Today it is a dynamic metropolis, where African, Portuguese, French, Dutch and local native tribal traditions mix together to generate a way of life reminiscent of the Caribbean.

Built on a ripple of hills overlooking the magnificent beaches of Bahia de Todos os Santos (All Saints' Bay), the city consists of two levels - Cidade Alta and Cidade Baixa, linked by the Lacerda Elevator. On the upper slopes stands Pelourinho, a UNESCO World Heritage site, where some 800 buildings from the 16th and 17th centuries, including fabulously lavish Baroque churches and the pastel-coloured mansions of the colonial sugar and cocoa barons, form a living museum. Lining the shore is Cidade Baixa and Bonfirm, the national hub of both traditional and contemporary Afro-Brazilian art and culture renowned for the exotic rituals and intoxicating rhythms of its spectacular religious and folk carnivals.

Places of interest: Pelourinho - the Old City, with its ornate churches, fascinating museums and numerous jewellery stores, art galleries, craft



shops, bars and restaurants; **Bonfirm** – a centre for schools of Capoeira, today an art form that was originally an African fighting technique practised surreptitiously in slave days through dance and percussion instruments; African-Brazilian dance and culture; Mercado Modelo and Feira de São Joaquim markets.

Best buys: World-famous Brazilian gemstones, handicrafts and local art.

Out and about: The beaches of Praia do Forte; TAMAR Sea Turtle Reserve; humpback whale watching; islands of Morro de Sao Paulo, Boipeba and Itaparica.
