Other Canadian cities like Toronto, Montreal, Vancouver, Quebec City, Halifax, Winnipeg, Edmonton, St John's and Charlottetown are equally popular destinations, offering a gamut of experiences that are a fascinating mix of urban sophistication and relaxed country living.


Canada's diversity is most apparent in its cuisine, which is truly a melting pot of Asian, European, Mediterranean and local flavours celebrated in elegant restaurants and humble eateries throughout the country.

When it comes to shopping, several days can be spent browsing through neighbourhoods in Toronto, Montreal or Vancouver. Tourists can look forward to many activities in the Canadian outdoors like hiking, horse riding, climbing, camping, kayaking and wildlife-watching. They can also experience an amazing variety of galleries, museums, performance arts, spectator sports and nightlife in the major cities or relax at the country's

many hot springs and spas, which are justly famous for their rejuvenating powers. Diverse and endlessly engaging, Canada's wide range of exciting options appeal to the explorer in everyone.

Sightseeing

Toronto – Canada's largest and most multicultural city is home to the CN Tower, one of the world's tallest; Hockey Hall of Fame;





Casa Loma Castle; Bata Shoe Museum; the Art Gallery of Ontario; the Royal Ontario Museum, Ontario Science Centre; the Entertainment District; Harbourfront Centre; Downtown Yonge, the historic Distillery District and the Niagara Falls, a two-hour drive away.

Montreal – A distinctively French flavour envelopes this charming city on St Lawrence River. The Jardin Botanique (Botanical Garden); the Biodome de Montreal; the Insectarium de Montreal (Insect Museum); the Musee des Beaux-Arts (Museum of Fine Arts); Pointe-a-Calliere (Museum of Archaeology and History) and 'Underground City', a 29-kilometre long, climate-controlled maze of 2000 shops.

Vancouver – Venue of the 2010 Olympic Winter Games, Vancouver is often listed as one of the world's 10 best cities. While it offers unmatched opportunities for exploring the outdoors, Vancouver is also intensely urban. The city's attractions include the Museum of Anthropology; the Vancouver Art Gallery; the Vancouver Aquarium Marine Science Centre, the Grouse Mountain Resort; the Dr. Sun Yat-Sen Classical Chinese Garden; the Nitobe Japanese Garden; Granville Island and Stanley Park – a 988-acre rainforest.

Banff and Jasper National Parks – Established in the province of Alberta in 1885 and covering 6,641 square kilometres, Banff is Canada's oldest national park. Also in Alberta, located north of Banff, is Jasper National Park, occupying an area of 10,878 square kilometres, it is Canada's largest national park and a UNESCO World Heritage site. Both parks offer spectacular scenery, wildlife and bird-watching and outdoor activities that include hiking, fishing, rafting, kayaking and camping.

Family activities

Hockey is Canada's most popular spectator sport and one of its most widely played recreational sports. Ice hockey is played nationwide during winter and lacrosse played likewise during summer. Despite Canadian winters, a variety of warm-weather sports are played indoors as well.

Day 1: Toronto

Arrive at Pearson International Airport and transfer to your hotel. Spend the day at leisure. Overnight in Toronto.

Day 2: Toronto

In the morning, we take you on a city tour, remainder of the day is at leisure. Overnight in Toronto.

Day 3: Toronto - Montreal (546 kilometres)

Drive along Lake Ontario's north shore to Montreal, pausing at Thousand Islands for a cruise. Overnight in Montreal.

Tour Montreal and visit the main sights and the bustling streets. Afternoon at leisure. Overnight in Montreal.

Day 5: Montreal — Quebec City (257 kilometres)

Travel to Quebec City via Chemin du Roy, where our tour will introduce you to the city's rich history and culture. Overnight in Quebec City.

Day 6: Quebec City

The day is at leisure to further explore the sights of this charming UNESCO World Heritage site and its narrow streets and unique boutiques. Overnight in Quebec City.

Day 7: Quebec City — Ottawa (447 kilometres)

Follow the north shore of St Lawrence to Ottawa, the nation's capital. Stop for lunch at Sucrerie de la Montagne, an authentic sugar shack and pioneerstyle restaurant. Remainder of the day is at leisure. Overnight in Ottawa.

After visiting Turtle Island for a unique celebration of contemporary native culture, we take you on a tour of the city. Afternoon at leisure. Overnight in Ottawa.

Day 9: Ottawa - Midland (338 kilometres)

Visit Algonquin Provincial Park and its scenic trails, before continuing to the Muskoka resort region. Overnight in Midland

Day 10: Midland — Niagara Falls (210 kilometres)

Visit Sainte-Marie among the Hurons, before heading south through orchards

and vineyards to Niagara Falls and a boat ride to the foot of the waterfalls. The evening is at leisure. Overnight in Niagara Falls.

Chateau Frontier, Quebec City

Day 11: Niagara Falls — Toronto (130 kilometres)

Ride to the top of the Skylon Tower for amazing views of the falls before visiting the historic village of Niagara-on-the-Lake and returning to Toronto. Overnight in Toronto.

Day 12: Toronto

The day is at leisure until your transfer to the airport for your flight home.

Total distance: 1,928 kilometres.

Toronto



Toronto, the capital of Ontario, is also considered Canada's entertainment, financial and business capital. Places of interest: CN Tower; Ontario Science Centre; Art Gallery of Ontario; Casa Loma Castle; Hockey Hall of Fame; Bata Shoe Museum; Royal Ontario Museum; Distillery District; Harbourfront Centre; Eaton Centre – one of the largest malls in Canada.

For the family: Ontario Place – a unique complex housing more than 30 rides and attractions; Woodie Woodchuck's Indoor Amusement Centre with over 70 games for kids; Fallsview Indoor Waterpark – water sports for all ages.


Best buys: Dr Flea's Highway 27 and Albion Flea Market – the largest indoor flea market and farmer's market; Unionville-Historic Main Street – an award-winning, heritage village with unique shops, cafés and restaurants; Ports 1961 shopping centre; Giliam's Fashions boutique shops

Out and about: Explore Toronto's Islands including Centreville Amusement Park or Lighthouse at Gibraltar Point, Algonquin Island. The islands are a car-free environment and are accessible by ferry.









Niagara Falls

Full-day coach excursion with lunch

This excursion takes you to the pretty village of Niagara-on-the-Lake before visiting the falls.

We head out of Toronto past vineyards and parklands to picturesque Niagara-on-the-Lake. One of the best-preserved 19th century towns in North America, it was originally a Native Indian site. Just 20 kilometres further on is the Niagara Falls, the most powerful waterfall in North America and one of the



world's most stupendous natural sights. The falls are composed of two major sections, separated by Goat Island: **Horseshoe Falls**, by far the most spectacular, on the Canadian side of the border and the **American and Bridal Veil Falls** on the United States side.

A guaranteed highlight is the noisy, wet and unimaginably thrilling boat ride on the **Maid of the Mist**, which takes you right up to the base of the mighty Horseshoe Falls. After returning to the shore, we stop at a restaurant for lunch with magnificent views of the roaring falls, before returning to Toronto.

This is a fully-narrated excursion and operates daily, which includes pick-up and drop-off to downtown Toronto hotels and lunch.

Note: The Maid of the Mist operates from mid-May to mid-October, weather permitting. In the off-season, the Maid of the Mist will be substituted by the Journey Behind the Falls.

InterContinental Toronto Vorkville

Location: Yorkville.
