
Germany





Throughout Germany the old and the new co-exist in harmony. Although one of the world's leading industrial nations, picturepostcard Germany is still much in evidence - glass façades of modern buildings are likely to reflect the ornate towers of a mediaeval cathedral; ancient

castles overlook not only the Rhine River but high-speed intercity train lines and highways.

Covering over 357,000-square kilometres, Germany is one of the largest European countries with landscapes varying from the Alps in the south to the beaches of the Baltic and North Seas, from the industrial heartland in the west to the open vistas of the European plain in the east. Between these lie vibrant cities with fabulous shopping and pulsating nightlife, enchanting mediaeval villages, vast tracts of quiet countryside reflecting

centuries of careful husbandry, steep-sided river valleys, deep, quiet forests and castles, palaces and abbeys seemingly untouched by time.

The people of Germany have a liking for the good things, standards that are reflected in every aspect of life. Hotels are excellent, public transport is clean and reliable, entertainment is exciting and varied and food universally good.

Pavement cafés (open-fronted in the summer and glassed-in during the winter), smart bistros, beer-halls and wine taverns may be found throughout the country, whilst top-class restaurants serve food from around the world.

As you might expect from a land of such diversity, there are holidays to suit just about everybody. You can join in the fun at a beergarden or in a wine cellar; take a cruise on the Rhine or Danube; investigate the wealth of museums and art galleries; take to the waters at Baden-Baden; ski in the Alps or cycle along tow-paths; marvel at the magnificence of Neuschwanstein fairy-tale castle or dance the night away in a lively nightclub.

Explore Berlin, once again the capital of a united Germany, where the contrast between east and west is still most obviously seen; discover Frankfurt, one of Europe's major financial and shopping centres; venture westwards to Düsseldorf, nicknamed the Paris of Germany, with its flair for fashion and style and visit nearby Cologne with its cathedral, perhaps the most magnificent Gothic church in Christendom. You can also head north, towards the great seaport of Hamburg or south to Munich, the



heart of Bavaria, with its outstanding museums and art galleries, strong tradition of music and of course, the exuberant Oktoberfest.

Europa Park – just a two-hour drive from Frankfurt, Movie Park Germany – only 40 kilometres from Düsseldorf; cruising on the Rhine and Danube Rivers.

What you can buy – High street fashion, designer goods, china and tableware, cuckoo clocks and hand-made Christmas decorations. Where you can buy – Maximilianstrasse in Munich, Königsallee, Old Town in Düsseldorf, Goethestrasse in Frankfurt, Jungfernstieg and Moenckebergstrasse in Hamburg, as well as Kurfürstendamm and Potsdamer Platz in Berlin.

Entertainment

Art galleries, opera, ballet, theatres, fashionable street cafés, traditional German pubs, gourmet restaurants, nightclubs, casinos and dinner cruises.







Train Journeys

An elegant travel experience

Railway enthusiasts maintain that the train is by far the most civilised form of transport yet invented. Travelling aboard one of Europe's modern expresses at speeds of up to 300 kph – you may well find yourself in agreement with them.

Across the continent's extensive rail network, fast and comfortable trains not only whisk you from city centre to city centre but can also take you to country towns and remote villages. En route you often travel through areas inaccessible by other means of transport, offering you a host of new perspectives of the landscape. And those with an interest in engineering

will marvel at the viaducts, tunnels, cuttings and embankments built by long-forgotten 19th century workers, whilst enthusiasts of architecture will admire the splendid termini of major cities and the vernacular styles of homely rural stations.

Whilst you may want to select from one of our three preset itineraries, these are merely suggestions designed to give you a flavour of what is possible. All travel arrangements, itineraries and accommodation options can be tailor-made to suit your individual preferences, giving you total freedom to explore places of your own choice and at your own pace. From mountains to moorlands, sophisticated cities to seaside resorts, Europe is yours by train.

Germany as-you-please

City options include Berlin, Cologne, Dresden, Düsseldorf, Frankfurt, Hamburg, Munich, Nuremberg and Stuttgart. The arrangements include international flights, second class rail travel throughout Germany, hotel accommodation including breakfast and city excursions. Transfers between stations and hotels can be added if required. Tailor-made itineraries need a minimum duration of four nights' accommodation and should cover at least two cities.



German Experience

9 days/8 nights • Train journey

Hamburg • Berlin • Frankfurt • Munich

We take you from the ancient Hanseatic city of Hamburg across the north German Plain to the country's capital, Berlin, before heading south-west to Frankfurt, an important banking, commercial and cultural hub and then south-east to Munich, Bavaria's flamboyant, easy going capital.

Day 1: Hamburg Arrive in Hamburg.

Germany's second largest and, some say, most beautiful city has been an important port for over a thousand years and today offers visitors a wealth of history, outstanding architecture and jubilant nightlife. We include a short harbour cruise. Overnight in Hamburg.



Day 3: Hamburg – Berlin (approximately 1 hour 30 minutes) The day is at leisure to enjoy. Overnight in Berlin.

Day 4: Berlin

This beautiful, thriving metropolis has a rich history and offers a vast range of attractions along with a lively entertainment scene.

Overnight in Berlin.

Day 5: Berlin - Frankfurt (approximately 3 hours 30 minutes)

Once again embark on the train to Frankfurt. The spectacular high-rise skyline has given the city its nickname 'Mainhattan', but amidst the modern office blocks glimpses of its mediaeval roots can still be seen in window-boxed houses, cobbled alleyways, traditional taverns and quaint squares. Overnight in Frankfurt.

Day 6: Frankfurt - Munich (approximately 3 hours)

Depart to Munich. The day is at leisure to enjoy. Overnight in Munich.

Days 7 - 9: Munich

Explore this exciting city, which happily combines the high culture of opera, art and museums with the simpler pleasures of oompah bands and lively beers halls. Overnight in Munich.

Munich • Salzburg • Vienna

Overshadowed for most of its length by the mighty Alps, this enthralling journey will introduce you to fascinating cities, some of Europe's finest architecture and magnificent mountain panoramas.

Day 1: Munich Arrive in Munich.

Day 2: Munich

Bavaria's charming capital offers an intriguing blend of culture, art and music. Mediaeval, Baroque and Rococo buildings cluster around the marketplace in the Marienplatz; orchestras, theatres, museums and art galleries vie for attention; and traditional crafts continue to flourish. Overnight in Munich.

Day 3: Munich - Salzburg (approximately 2 hours)

Depart by train to Salzburg. The day is at leisure to enjoy. Overnight in Salzburg.

Day 4: Salzburg

Attractively located in the foothills of the Alps, the birthplace of Mozart combines lovely architecture with a year-round programme of cultural events – from orchestral to rock concerts, operas to musicals and folk dancing to street festivals. Overnight in Salzburg.

Day 5: Salzburg – Vienna (approximately 3 hours 15 minutes)
Depart on your train journey to Vienna. The day is at leisure to enjoy.
Overnight in Vienna.

Days 6 - 7: Vienna

Austria's imperial past is recalled in the city's magnificent palaces, stately mansions and wide boulevards. Vienna is one of the world's greatest cultural centres – home of composers, ensembles, orchestras and choirs, and with more than 200 museums and galleries displaying priceless works of art. Viennese cuisine can be enjoyed in hundreds of restaurants; the city's coffee houses are renowned for their cakes and pastries; and Heuriger, wine taverns, unite music, food and wine in a uniquely Viennese blend. Overnight in Vienna.

Day 5: Paris – Amsterdam (approximately 5 hours)

Your next destination awaits you. Depart on the train heading for Amsterdam. The day is at leisure to enjoy. Overnight in Amsterdam.

Day 6: Amsterdam

Amsterdam remains one of Europe's most attractive cities, where 17th century gabled houses line the canals. The historic centre offers a host of museums and galleries. Overnight in Amsterdam.

Day 7: Amsterdam - London (approximately 6 hours)


Leave Amsterdam and depart to your final stop - London. The day is at leisure to enjoy. Overnight in London.

Day 1: Frankfurt


Arrive in Frankfurt and transfer to your hotel for an overnight stay.

Day 2: Frankfurt — Heidelberg (91 kilometres)

Depart from Frankfurt and head to Ruedesheim located on the banks of the River Rhine where you board the Rhine steamer for a scenic cruise. The tour will then take you to Heidelberg. Enjoy dinner at one of the oldest restaurants in Germany. Overnight in Heidelberg.

Day 3: Heidelberg — Lake Constance (195 kilometres)

In the morning head south for the Black Forest where you stop at one of the factories that make the famous cuckoo clocks, then go onward to the largest lake in Germany – Lake Constance. Overnight at Lake Constance area.



Day 4: Lake Constance — Innsbruck (200 kilometres)

After breakfast we take the German Alpine Road to the Wies church, a beautiful rococo church. We go on to Hohenschwangau where we visit Neuschwanstein Castle. We then cross the Austrian border and drive to Innsbruck. Overnight in Innsbruck.

Day 5: Innsbruck — Salzburg (190 kilometres)

We visit the Swarovsky
Kristallwelten factory near
Innsbruck and move on to
Kehlsteinhaus – the Eagle's
Nest. Experience the magnificent
view over the Alps and Lake
Königssee. Take a short ride to
Salzburg. Overnight in Salzburg.

Day 6: Salzburg — Munich (112 kilometres)

The morning starts with a walking tour of Salzburg, the city of Mozart. Visit Getreidegasse, the cathedral, the festival house and the birthplace of Mozart. We then head north to Munich, the capital of Bavaria, with the Nymphenburg castle, Maximilianstrasse, the Opera, the Olympic Grounds and the Marienplatz with the City Hall. Overnight in Munich.

Day 7: Munich — Rothenburg (200 kilometres)

Leave Munich after breakfast and head north to Nuremberg for a city tour. We then follow the Castle Road to Rothenburg. Overnight in Rothenburg.

Day 8: Rothenburg — Frankfurt (190 kilometres)

Tour around Rothenburg, "the mediaeval jewel of Germany" and visit the Jacob Church, city hall and much more. You can use the morning and visit Kaethe Wohlfart's World of Christmas. We then head to the beautiful cathedral of Wuerzburg. In the afternoon we head back to Frankfurt.

Total distance: 1,178 kilometres.

Bavaria's charming capital happily combines the high culture of opera, art and museums with the simpler pleasures of oompah bands, beer halls and the Oktoberfest, a celebratory cornucopia of food, drink and conviviality. Situated just north of the Alps, Munich conveniently lies at the crossroads of Europe bordering Switzerland, Austria and Italy.

Places of interest: The BMW Museum, with its collection of vintage cars; the beautiful English Garden, with shaded paths, ponds, swans and beer gardens; fairy tale Neuschwanstein Castle can be reached via scenic drives through pastoral and mountain scenery; and quaint towns such as Oberammergau.

For the family: Take a train to Germany's highest mountain, the 2,962-metre Zugspitze, for spectacular views of Lake Tegernsee; Legoland, between Munich and Stuttgart, has more than 40 rides and attractions.

Best buys: Maximilianstrasse is a boulevard of stylish boutiques and



chic shops; the pedestrian zone near **Marienplatz** retains much of its old character and is the place to find souvenirs.

Out and about: Hofbräuhaus, the famous brewery; Schwabing offers a mix of bars, discothèques and trendy cafés and boat rides on Lake Chiemsee.

Sporting attractions: Garmisch-Partenkirchen for winter sports, summer hiking, mountain climbing and magnificent Alpine views as well as the spa town of Bad Reichenhall.








Neuschwanstein Castle and Linderhof Palace

Full-day coach excursion from Munich

Our excursion begins high in the Bavarian hills where the eccentric King Ludwig II built two extraordinary castles that are amongst the most romantic sights in all of Germany.

Neuschwanstein is an idealised mediaeval castle, built to plans made by a theatre set designer rather than an architect and is situated on a rocky promontory above a steep gorge overlooking the lake far below.



In contrast, the rococo Linderhof

Palace is modelled along the lines of the great French palace at Versailles, although on a much smaller scale.

We then head to the village of Oberammergau for a short shopping break. 400 years ago the villagers, seeking deliverance from the plague, promised that they would perform the Passion Play every 10 years. They have done so, with only two exceptions, since 1634.

This is a coach excursion, which commences and ends at Le Méridien Munich. It operates daily from April to October and daily except Mondays from November to March. The excursion includes entrance fees and an English-speaking guide.





For the family: Movie Park Germany – amusement park with restaurants, stores and thrilling rides; and river cruises on the Rhine.


