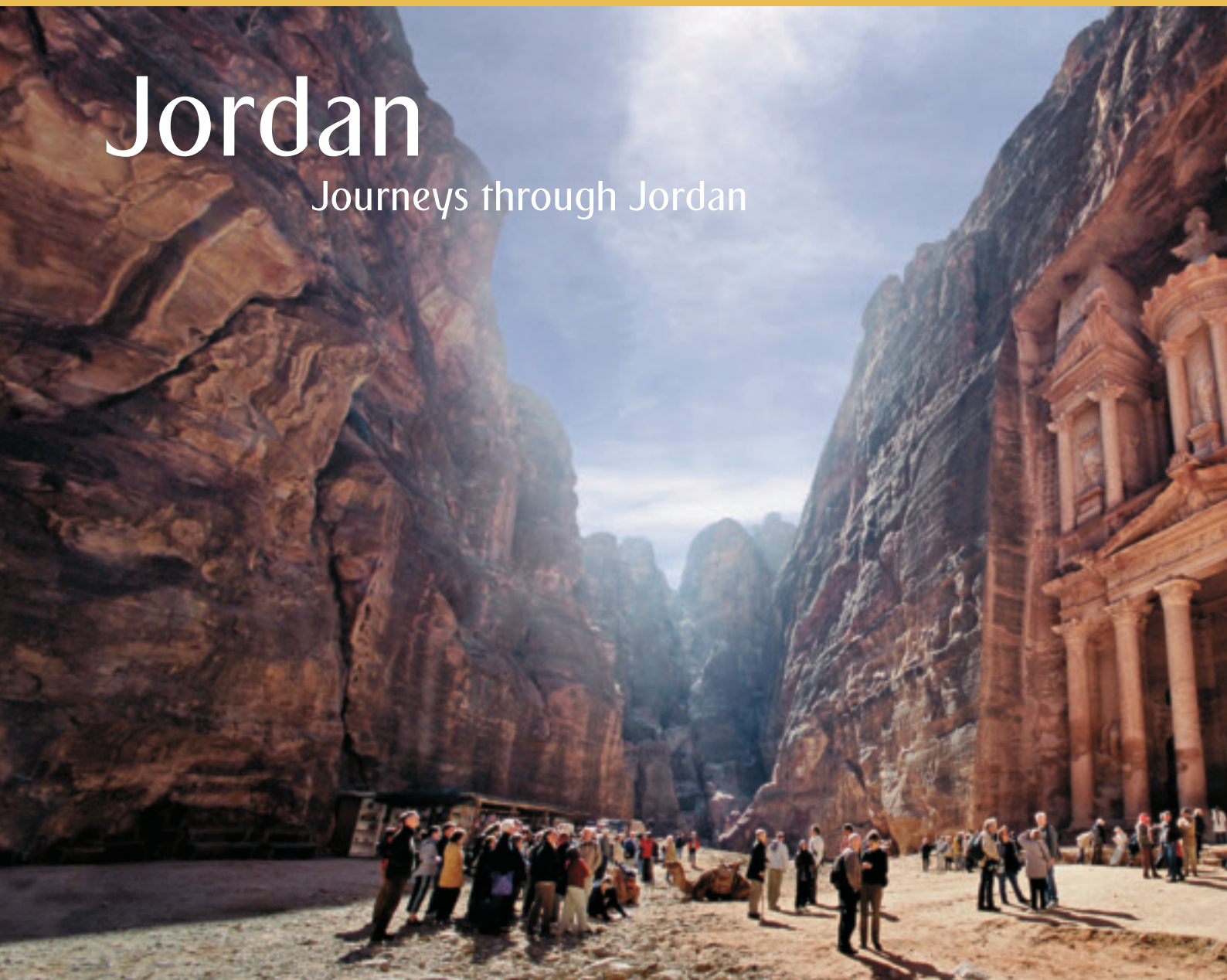

Journeys through Jordan



Aqaba

Since time immemorial, Jordan has been a crossroad for migrating people, invading armies and international trade. With a history dating back over two millennia, the country teems with mementoes of many races, including walled Canaanite cities, Greek palaces, Muslim shrines, Byzantine churches, the huge Roman city of Jerash and the lost city of Petra, hewn by the Nabataeans from solid rock.

A well-travelled bridge between sea and desert, east and west, the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan is a land of mesmerising beauty and contrasts. The nature of Jordan varies

from the stunning desert landscapes of Wadi Rum to the green valley of the Jordan River and the unique, salty beaches of the Dead Sea. In the south the Gulf of Aqaba offers opportunities for water sports. In the desert of Wadi Rum camping, hiking and jeep tours are offered. Experience the old Bedouin lifestyle during a camel ride from Wadi Rum to Wadi Mousa near Petra and Aqaba. Jeep tours and climbing excursions can also be arranged. Today, Jordan also offers relaxation and rejuvenation at the luxurious resort spas set on the shores of the Dead Sea – a great escape from the stress of modern life.

The capital city of Amman spreads across 19 hills, many of which are over 800 metres above sea level. Downtown Amman is located around the King Hussein Mosque, at the lowest level of the city. The big, blue dome of the King Abdullah Mosque as well as the black and white striped Abu Darwish Mosque are important landmarks of the city. One of the highlights of Amman is the Roman Theatre, with a capacity of 6,000 people. The National Archaeological Museum and the Jordan National Gallery of Fine Arts inform the visitors about the history and culture of Jordan.

More spectacular than the capital city of Amman, is the ancient Roman city of Jerash. It is remarkably well preserved, compact and easily accessible. The huge hippodrome for 15,000 visitors, the South Theatre with amazing acoustics, the large Oval Plaza and the colonnaded street and many other sites of Jerash make the city Jordan's major attraction after Petra.



Jerash



Certainly one of the biggest attractions in the Middle East is the city of Petra. Visitors who walk to the As-Siq, the dramatic, long and narrow gorge to The Treasury in the early hours of the morning, can see the first rays of the sun shine on this marvellous building, giving it the pink colour it is so famous for, during the rest of the day. The Royal Tombs and The Monastery are further attractions in the imposing city and offer great views of the old city centre.

Sightseeing

The city of Petra, the Roman city of Jerash, mountain and desert landscapes, castle ruins, Roman theatres, churches, mosques and the Dead Sea.

Accommodation

City hotels, resort spas and valley hotels.

Family activities

Hashemite Square, Luna Park and Haya Cultural Centre in Amman, the aquarium and the beaches in Aqaba. Children’s entertainment and activities at the Dead Sea resort spas.

Shopping

What you can buy – Bedouin rugs and tapestries, embroidery, brass and copper goods, ceramics, handmade glass, inlaid boxes, coloured sand bottles, silver Bedouin jewellery and natural Dead Sea beauty products.

Where you can buy – Souks, shopping malls and tourist bazaars.

Oriental coffee shops, local and international restaurants, Kan Zayman restaurant and tourism village, hotel bars and discothèques.

Sports and leisure

Horse and camel riding at Petra; spas, health treatments and swimming at the Dead Sea.




Events

Jerash Music Festival (July – August); Petra Exhibition (September – January).

Day 1: Amman

Day 2: Amman (50 kilometres)

Your morning tour of the city introduces the major sights of Amman including the Citadel and the Temple of Hercules. Proceed on to Jerash, one of the most well-preserved Roman cities before returning back. Overnight in Amman.

Day 3: Amman — Petra (380 kilometres)

After breakfast, you drive to Madaba, the city of mosaics, visiting Mount Nebo and the castles of Mkawer and Kerak before proceeding to Petra. Overnight in Petra.



Dead Sea

Day 4: Petra

A full-day for you to explore Petra's magnificent tombs, temples and other buildings, before visiting the 8,000-year-old stone-age villages. Overnight in Petra.

Day 5: Petra — Dead Sea (310 kilometres)

After breakfast, you transfer to Wadi Rum

for a jeep tour of the enchanting desert. Later on, you proceed to the Dead Sea, the lowest point on earth. Overnight at the Dead Sea.

Day 6: Dead Sea

A full-day at leisure to enjoy one of the most spectacular and spiritual landscapes on earth and the world's richest source of natural salts. You could opt to indulge in the many therapies available at the luxurious spa available at your hotel. Overnight at the Dead Sea.

Day 7: Dead Sea — Amman (60 kilometres)

Transfer from your hotel to Queen Alia International Airport for your return flight home.

Total distance: 800 kilometres.

Amman

City of seven hills

Located on the ancient trade routes linking the Mediterranean and Arabia, Amman, like Rome is built on seven hills. It is a fascinating city of contrasts – a unique blend of old and new, ideally situated on a hilly area between the desert and the fertile Jordan valley. Hills covered with beige, pale ochre and white houses gave rise to the name ‘The White City’.

Whilst present day Amman is a relatively new city which has grown rapidly over the past 50 years, it is one of the oldest inhabited places in the world and evidence of its long history can be found in its well-preserved Roman buildings.

In the commercial heart of the city, modern buildings, restaurants and boutiques rub shoulders with traditional coffee shops and artisans’ workshops. The residential suburbs consist of mainly tree-lined streets and avenues flanked by elegant, almost uniform white houses. The downtown area is much older and more traditional with smaller businesses producing and selling everything from intricate jewellery to everyday household items.

Places of interest: The **Roman Amphitheatre**, dating back to 151 AD and built to seat 6,000 people and the **Folklore Museum**; nearby the



huge Roman ruined city of **Jerash**, one of the best-preserved Roman provincial towns in the world; **Desert Castles** and the **Dead Sea Resort spas**.

Best buys: Amman’s gold souk for a variety of handmade jewellery and tourist shops for traditional handicrafts. **Al Khayyam Oriental Bazaar** for handcrafted copper items, mother of pearl and olivewood products. Shopping is also available in **Sweifeh**, **Jabal Al-Hussein**, **Abdoun Mall** and **Amman Mall**.

Out and about: Amman’s nightlife is centred around dining out, hotel bars and nightclubs. Well worth a visit is **Kan Zayman**, an authentically-restored Jordanian village offering excellent food and craft shops.

Amman and Jerash tour

Full-day chauffeur-driven private car excursion from Amman

This tour covers some of the most well-known historical sites in Amman as well as one of the best-preserved Roman provincial towns in the world – Jerash.

The tour begins with a visit to the **Citadel**. Towering above downtown Amman, the Citadel is the site of ancient Rabbath-Ammon and excavations here have revealed numerous Roman and early Islamic remains.

You then proceed to the **Roman Theatre**, an imposing monument set into the side of the mountain, which can seat 6,000 people and is still used for performances today.

Our next visit is the **National Archaeological Museum**, which houses an excellent collection of antiquities, including the famous **Copper Scroll** of the Dead Sea Scrolls.

Drive on to the ancient city of **Jerash**, acknowledged internationally as one of the largest and most well-preserved sites of Roman architecture in the world. Hidden for centuries in the sand, Jerash reveals a fine example of the grand, formal provincial Roman urbanism comprising paved and colonnaded streets, hilltop temples, theatres, public squares and plazas and city walls.

Full-day chauffeur-driven private car tour from Aqaba

The giant red mountains and vast mausoleums of a departed race have nothing in common with modern civilisation and ask nothing of it except to be appreciated at their true value - as one of the greatest wonders ever created by nature and man.

Although much has been written about **Petra**, nothing really prepares you for this amazing place. It has to be seen to be believed. Considered a wonder of the ancient world, Petra is without doubt Jordan’s most valuable treasure. This unique city, carved into the sheer rock face by the Nabataeans, over 2,000 years ago, turned it into an important junction for the silk, spice and other trade routes.



Visiting Petra for the first time is always an unforgettable experience. We first stop by the **Qasr al-Bint Temple** of the Nabatean capital, the site is awe-inspiring in every aspect. What really leaves an impression however, is the walk through the **Siq**, the narrow ancient entrance to the site that is surrounded by cliffs soaring up to 80 metres high. Nearing the end of the gorge the Treasury reveals itself to the visitors. After exploring the site you will be transferred back to Aqaba city.

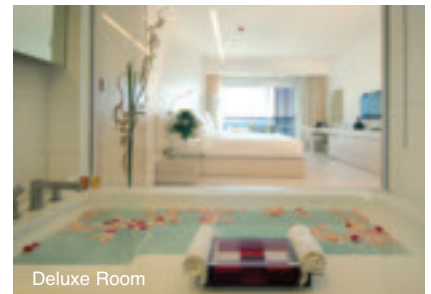

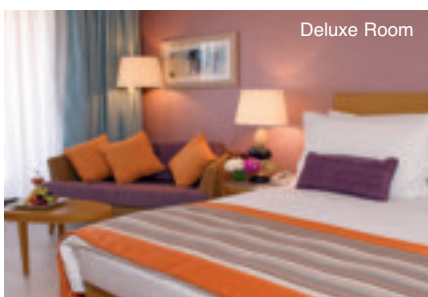

The Dead Sea

Lowest point on the earth's surface

The Dead Sea has a historical and spiritual legacy of its own. Although sparsely populated and serenely quiet, the area is believed to be the site of five biblical cities. With much of the landscape virtually unchanged since ancient times, this is a favourite spot for a holiday.

Just 40 minutes from Amman this landlocked salt lake is 410 metres below sea level – the lowest point on the earth’s surface. Its warm, soothing waters are rich in beneficial minerals that soothe the skin and because of its high salt content you can simply relax in it and float away with ease.

The resorts of the Dead Sea offer luxurious accommodation, fine dining, children’s activities freshwater swimming pools, spa treatments and leisure activities and are the perfect place to relax and rejuvenate in a beautiful, natural and tranquil environment. The elegant spas provide a full range of both Dead Sea and international brand beauty treatments allowing you to indulge in the art of well-being.

Places of interest: **Mount Nebo** is situated west of Madaba on the edge of the plateau and on a clear day it is possible to see the Dead Sea and the spires of the churches; **Lot’s Sanctuary**, a historic cave located on Modern Safi set on a hill by a tiny spring overlooking the Dead Sea; the **Mujib Nature Reserve**, the ruined Roman city of **Jerash** which was discovered in 1806, **Madaba** with its ancient mosaics of the Byzantine era makes an excellent day trip. The most interesting mosaic is in the Greek Orthodox church of St George.






For the family: The Dead Sea resorts cater to families and offer a variety of children’s activities.

Best buys: Dead Sea mud products and international beauty treatments.

Out and about: Hotel restaurants and bars. The city of **Amman** is just a 40-minute drive.

Bethany and Mount Nebo tour

Half-day chauffeur-driven private car excursion from Dead Sea

This excursion covers the ancient sites around the area of the **Dead Sea**.

Our first stop is **Mount Nebo**. Attracting tourists from around the world, Mount Nebo is the burial site of Moses. The view from the top of this mountain offers expansive views that encompass the **Jordan River Valley**, the Dead Sea and beyond. According to legend, this is also the place where Jeremiah hid the Ark of the Covenant and it has been a place of pilgrimage for early Christians.

The church at the site contains six tombs, from different periods and has been found hollowed out of the rock beneath the mosaic-covered floor of the church. In the present presbytery you can see remnants of mosaics, the earliest of which is a panel with a braided cross.

Our next stop is **Bethany** - it is believed John the Baptist preached and baptized here and it is often referred to as Bethany Beyond the Jordan. Close by is **Tell a-Kharrar** and **Elijah's hill** identified in texts of the Byzantine and Mediaeval eras, as well as modern archaeological documents.

Visitors can also see other stunning archaeological discoveries like the architectural remains of a 5th century Byzantine monastery as well as a 3rd century building with fine mosaics and a cave where John the Baptist is believed to have lived.

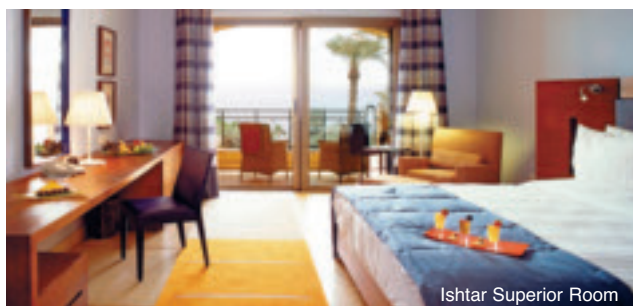

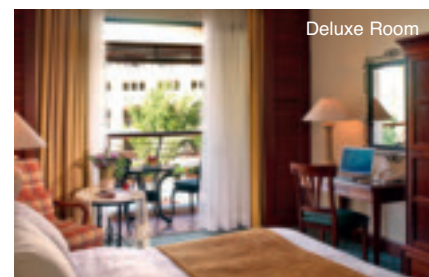

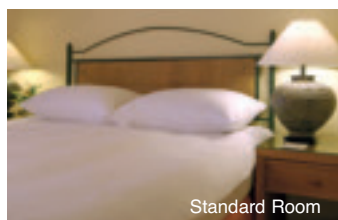
