

Lebanon Jewel of the Mediterranean



Lebanon, with its kindly climate, fascinating history, superb shopping, lively nightlife and sophisticated modern culture is a Mediterranean jewel just waiting to be discovered.

Geographically, Lebanon is as diverse as it is possible to imagine in a country so small. In a very compact space there is a coastal plain with ancient historical cities strung along its length, a soaring mountain range with popular ski resorts and an agricultural plain bound in by a second mountain range. Culturally too, there is diversity: the ancient Christian heritage and the Islamic architecture mix throughout the country with the classic remains of earlier civilisations.

The country offers an immense variety of travel experiences.

Baalbeck with the Temples of Jupiter and Bacchus is the most impressive historical site in Lebanon. Byblos is believed to be the world's oldest continually inhabited town. The site has been occupied at least for 700 years. The historic harbour and the old city centre are still unspoiled and very picturesque. Sidon, once an important Phoenician city, and the Great Mosque and Phoenician Temple in nearby Echmoun are monuments of the great

past of the country.

The second largest city of Lebanon, Tripoli, is situated in the northern part of the coast, the home of the famous Cedars. Many traditional crafts are found in the souks of Tripoli. The city is also known as the sweets capital of Lebanon, therefore a visit to one of the several Arabic sweet shops is a must for every guest of the city. For a relaxing day on the beach, Jounieh about 20 kilometres north of Beirut is the right place to go.

The famous cedar trees, the symbol of Lebanon can be seen in different parts of the country. The Jeita Grotto near Beirut offers a stunning series of caves. Boat rides with sound and light shows are offered to visitors. Another famous area is Grotto North of Beirut and the Afqa Grotto, believed to be the place where the god Adonis was killed by a wild boar.

Syria lies on the eastern seaboard of the Mediterranean Sea. Here civilisation flourished 45 centuries ago. Since the dawn of civilisation, Syria has been a meeting place and a crossroad, where different people and cultures of the world empires met.

Damascus, capital of Syria, is a distinguished city, which charms the visitor with its old quarters and its modern aspect. This city presents a well blended combination of ancient and the modern. Besides its famous Omayad Mosque and the old Arab souks, its museums and ancient houses, there are commercial centres, modern hotels and libraries which contain the most important old manuscripts. From both the human and the cultural side there are treasures which give pleasure to the visitors of Syria.

Day 1: Beirut – Baalbeck – Damascus

You depart from your Beirut hotel and head for Damascus, Syria. En route visit the temple complex of Baalbeck, one of the most extraordinary and enigmatic holy places of ancient times and the largest stone block construction found in the entire world. After this visit we continue to Damascus. Overnight in Damascus.

Day 2: Damascus

This morning start the day with a city tour which introduces you to the major sights of Damascus including the Damascus Museum founded in



1919 and now the central Museum of Syria, Umayyed Mosque, considered as one of the most important architectural achievements during the early stages of the Islamic state, Azem Palace, built in the 18th century, Saladin memorial, Ananaias Chapel and Dam Bazar, the covered straight-line street that was reconstructed in the late 19th century. Overnight in Damascus.

Day 3: Damascus - Beirut

After breakfast leave Damascus and return to your Beirut hotel enjoying the grand drive.

Beirut Paris of the Middle East

Sporting attractions: Winter skiing.




Enchanting Beirut and Byblos

In **Jeita** you will discover some of the best caverns in the Middle East. Transfer by cable car to the caverns sculpted by water and discover a vast honeycomb of galleries and ravines with spectacular rock formations.



Harissa is one of the country's most renowned landmarks and home of the statue of the Virgin Mary, known as Our Lady of Lebanon. Around her are the churches and cathedrals of various denominations.

The world's oldest continually inhabited town of **Byblos** goes back 7,000 years. Explore the old part of the town, starting from fisherman's harbour and leading to the church of **St John the Baptist**, before returning back to Beirut.








Only 60 kilometres from Beirut, the snowy peaks of Mount Lebanon await the skiers and snowboarders during the winter season from December to March. The Mzaar and Faraya areas are the most important ski destinations in the Middle East, with 80 kilometres of slopes, 18 lifts and a capacity of 20,000 skiers per hour. The difficulty of the slopes varies with easy pistes for the beginners to more challenging areas for the enthusiasts.

While skiing, snowboarding and snowmobiling are the main attractions during the winter, the

area offers many outdoor activities all year-round. Hiking in the area is very popular during the summer and many interesting archaeological sites can be found in the mountains.
