Variety can be found in landscapes too; rice terraces climbing up mountain sides, islands rimmed by sandy beaches and sapphire seas and a perfectly symmetrical volcano rising above the encircling forest.

The Philippines has a variety to offer. Here you will find lively cities with entertainment to suit all tastes; remote islands with vast, empty beaches and mountainous interiors, secluded coves where giant sea turtles come ashore to lay their eggs; Taal Lake, formed in the caldera of a volcano with another volcano set on an island in its midst; rapids to be shot at Pagsanjan; and offshore waters abounding with game fish.

With the Filipinos' love for festivals, fiestas and enjoyment of life in general, visitors will find a wealth of diversions throughout the islands. In Manila there are regular performances of classical concerts and ballet. Shoppers will find the Philippines to be one of Asia's most inexpensive destinations.

Where you can buy – Malls, department stores, boutiques, flea markets and antique shops. In Manila the big malls in Makati area, EDSA and Divisoria.



Manila • Puerto Princesa

- Manila, a teaming metropolis
- Puerto Princesa, capital of Palawan

This five-day tour takes you on a tropical getaway to Puerto Princesa, a city in the centre of Palawan Island. Puerto Princesa is bordered by two seas – on the east coast by the Sulu Sea and on the west by the South China Sea. A highlight of your stay is the amazing Puerto Princesa Subterranean River National Park, reputedly the longest navigable and most beautiful underground river in the world.

Day 1: Manila

After arrival in Manila, the day is at leisure. Overnight in Manila.

Day 2: Manila - Puerto Princesa

In the morning, fly to Puerto Princesa and transfer to your hotel. In the afternoon, during our city tour, you will see the State College Museum, the crocodile farm, pineapple-fibre weavers, the city market and Iwahig Penal Colony, a financially self-supporting low security prison where over a thousand inmates live and work, farming and making craft items. Overnight in Puerto Princesa.

Day 3: Puerto Princesa

After breakfast, depart for an exciting visit to Saint Paul Subterranean Park on an eight-kilometre paddle boat journey along the underground



river past huge stalactites, walls with fluted columns and through a vast bat-filled cavern. Enjoy a picnic lunch in the shade of tall mahogany trees at the seaside park just outside the cave, where monkeys and large (but harmless and friendly) monitor lizards roam freely. Overnight in Puerto Princesa.

Day 4: Puerto Princesa

After breakfast, transfer to Honda Bay for a day of island-hopping, including Bat Island, home to thousands of bats; Snake Island, named because of its shape; and Pandan, Starfish and Luli Islands, where there are ample opportunities for snorkelling, swimming and sunbathing. Enjoy a picnic lunch on one of the islands before returning. Overnight in Puerto Princesa.

Day 5: Puerto Princesa - Manila

Full-day at leisure before your transfer to the airport for your onward flight back to Manila.

Manila

The exciting city

Manila, as a result of the Philippines' long association with Spain and America, is today one of the most westernised of Asian cities. The city's modern history begins with the arrival of the Spanish, who in search of spices, colonised the islands in the 16th century. Their legacy can be seen throughout the old town, where forts and churches, street names and municipal buildings recall the Iberian influence. Overlaid on this is the effect of American involvement in the first half of the 20th century most obviously seen in the jeepney. Today, Manila is pure Filipino from its nightlife, to its fabulous fiestas.

Places of interest: Intramuros, the original Spanish settlement; Casa Manila Museum; San Agustin Church and Museum; Malacañang Palace, former residence of Spanish generals; Las Pinas City; Roxas Boulevard; Rizal Park, the largest park in Manila.

For the family: Glorietta Mall; The Enchanted Kingdom; Makati Avenue, Jupiter Street and Rockwell Center; Forbes Park.

Best buys: Everything from handicrafts to high fashion. Available at malls in **Makati** and flea markets in **Divisoria**.

Out and about: Nayong Pilipino Cultural Park; Tagaytay and Taal Volcano and Lake; Laguna's hot springs and Pagsanjan rapids.





Cebu, the bustling capital of the eponymous island province, is the oldest city in the Philippines – and Cebuanos are justly proud of their intellectual and historical heritage. Today the city, clustered around its natural harbour, is second only to Manila in commercial and cultural importance and is a focal point of growth and development in Southern Philippines.

Cebu, a fusion of traditional and modern, presents a kaleidoscope of varying cultures and lifestyles. The nightlife is amongst the most vibrant in the Philippines – bars, cafés, discos and nightclubs abound, especially around Colon Street and Osmena Boulevard; there is a wide choice of excellent restaurants, particularly in the Ayala district, many specialising in the region's superb seafood; and there are two casinos.

In contrast to the lively metropolis, the province's 167 peaceful islets and islands are fringed with pristine white sandy beaches washed by the crystalline waters of the Cebu and Tanon Straits, where coral reefs harbour a colourful world of tropical marine life. Cebu has gained wide popularity for its excellent resorts, luxurious accommodation, world-class golf courses, and superb diving areas and diving facilities.

Places of interest: Magellan's Cross and Lapu Lapu Shrine; Colon Street, the oldest street in the country and part of Cebu's original Chinatown; Fort San Pedro, near the waterfront, dating back more than 500 years;



San Agustin Church, now known as the Basilica of Santo Niño, housing the country's oldest religious relic – the image of the Holy Child presented to Queen Juana by Magellan; University of San Carlos Museum.

For the family: Jumalon Butterfly Sanctuary & Art Gallery; Moalboal Orchid Display.



White Beach is one of the most famous stretches of beach in the country and is about four kilometres long lined with resorts, hotels, houses and restaurants. It features bright, fine sand and clear shallow waters.

But there is much more to the island than just natural beauty. With accommodation ranging from modern resorts to casual dive lodges, a vast range of sporting activities, a challenging 18-hole, par-72 world-class golf course, intriguing shops and markets, a host of bars and restaurants, and its warm, friendly people, Borocay is much more than merely a great place in which to relax.

Marinduque Island Tranquil island of beaches

Marinduque is a treasure trove of exquisite natural beauty. This island of 370 square miles is dotted with various white sand beaches, well-preserved diving sited, enchanting caves, rejuvenating hot springs and tranquil islets that provide for the perfect gateway.

Being an island of volcanic origin, hot springs are a common feature in the island. Caves are also natural feature of the island. For dividing enthusiasts, the best dive sites in the island can be found in Buena Vista town in the vicinity of the Tres Reyes Islands.



Lagen Island

Caves, coves, cliffs and lagoons

Situated in Bacuit Bay in Palawan's remote northern province of El Nido, Lagen must be amongst the loveliest of the more than 7,000 islands that make up the Philippines archipelago. Washed by the crystal-clear waters of the South China Sea, the shoreline of sandy coves is towered over by sheer limestone cliffs set against dense forests.

Lagen is situated within the El Nido Marine Reserve Park with its immense diversity of marine life – over 200 species of fish, more than 100 corals and giant clam gardens. It is the nesting ground of three types of sea turtles and dolphins, whale sharks and dugongs feed here. On land, there are more than 70 species of birds.

Places of interest: Boracay Island – Kar-Tir Shell Museum; Caves of the Flying Dogs, home to giant fruit bats; Mount Luho; the Dead Forest.

Marinduque Island – Paadyao Cascades; Bathala Caves; Red Mountain; Boac's exuberantly Gothic cathedral.

Lagen Island – See Bacuit Bay and its spectacular scenery on an island hopping boat. Miniloc Island's lagoons, ringed by vertical cliffs, are exceptionally lovely.

For the family: Boracay Island – Outrigger or motor boat cruises; Kingfisher's Fish Farm; Balabag, Diniwid, White and Punta beaches.

Marinduque Island – WHS Butterfly Farm; Marinduque Museum; take part in the Moriones, a spectacularly colourful religious festival preceding Easter.

Lagen Island – Walk through the island's evergreen rainforest, where monkeys and Palawan Hornbills may be seen.

Best buys: Boracay Island – Beach wear and T-shirts; Talipapa market for fashion and specialty shops; open-air markets feature antique furniture, lamps and native woodcarvings; puka shells.

Marinduque Island – Handicrafts, including Moriones Festival masks. Lagen Island – Handicrafts, T-shirts, beachwear and sarongs.

Out and about: Boracay Island – Resorts, restaurants and bars feature music, dancing and cultural shows.

Marinduque Island – White Beach at Barangay Poctoy is a social centre of the island.

Lagen Island – El Nido town has a good selection of restaurants and bars, many with views across the bay.

Sporting attractions: Boracay Island – Diving and snorkelling; sailing; windsurfing; kite boarding; banana-boat riding; golf; horseriding; tennis; mountain biking; hiking; motor biking and wall climbing.

Marinduque Island – Golf (nine-hole course), diving and cock fighting. Lagen Island – Diving, snorkelling, kayaking, fishing and cliff climbing.




