
# Spain

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Flamenco and fiestas, tapas and beaches, castles and cathedrals; scintillating Spain lives up to all its clichés – and much, much more. The Spanish landscape possesses a diversity that is quite simply outstanding; from the towering peaks of the wild Pyrenees in the north to the sun-drenched costas of the Mediterranean, from the sleepy whitewashed mediaeval villages of Andalucia to the Rioja vineyards of the Basque country, from the volcanic subtropical landscapes of the Canary Islands to the fertile green fields of Galicia. Geographic variety is matched by cultural diversity. The country's architectural heritage includes Roman churches, Moorish palaces, Gothic cathedrals, Renaissance mansions, Baroque universities and Gaudi's whimsical Art-Nouveau creations; Spanish opera singers Montserrat Caballé, Plácido Domingo and José Carreras are justly world-renowned; in art, Velázquez, Goya, El Greco, Miró, Picasso and Dali all flourished here while role models in the world of sport – Rafael Nadal, Seve Ballesteros, Fernando Alonso, David Villa, Fernando Torres have encouraged wider participation and the provision of new facilities.

Diverse the nation may be, but Spaniards are united by a capacity to enjoy life to the fullest. In towns and villages people still go out in the evening for the paseo, when the streets are crowded with strollers; communal eating is usual, with large groups meeting for tapas or dinner; and fiestas present a chance for everyone to take a break from day-to-day life and celebrate.

With its spectacular landscapes and rich history, Spain possesses a wealth of attractions from vibrant cities, numerous UNESCO World Heritage sites to some of the world's finest museums and art galleries.

#### Accommodation

Hotels in Spain offer a vast range of accommodation from world-class luxury properties and golf resorts to more modest establishments that still provide excellent value. Traditional *fincas* (small farmhouses) may be rented, providing peace and quiet away from the hustle of the coast.

#### Day 1: Madrid

Arrive at Madrid Barajas International Airport. After clearing simple immigration and customs formalities, you will be transferred to your hotel. We suggest you take advantage of the free time to get to know one of Europe's most dynamic capital cities. Early evening, enjoy an 'Illuminated Madrid', drive through the bustling streets of the old city, ending at the historical and impressive Plaza Mayor. This area is home to some of the most typical restaurants and taverns which serve delicious 'tapas'. Return to your hotel at your own convenience. Overnight in Madrid.

#### Day 2: Madrid

This morning's escorted sightseeing tour will allow you to get a glimpse of some of Madrid's most outstanding attractions, like the Puerta del Sol, the magnificent fountains of Neptune and Cibeles, the stately Alcala Gate, the busy Gran Via, the Plaza de España and the Plaza de Oriente. After lunch proceed to Imperial, former capital city of Toledo, where you will be escorted through its narrow cobblestone streets, soaking up the mediaeval atmosphere. Touring will include the interior of the magnificent Gothic Cathedral and a visit to St. Tome Church, where El Greco's masterpiece painting is displayed. There will also be some time to shop for unique and typical local handicrafts. Overnight in Madrid.

#### Day 3: Madrid - Merida - Seville (536 kilometres)

Depart through the once-remote region of Extremadura, home to many of the 'conquistadors'. Arrive in ancient Merida. After lunch, visit the impressive Roman amphitheatre archaeological site before continuing to Seville. Overnight in Seville.

#### Day 4: Seville

This morning's marvellous tour takes you to explore this gracious and charming city, Spain's third largest. See the Tower of Gold, the tranquil and extensive Maria Luisa Park, the quaint Santa Cruz Quarter and finally the huge cathedral (one of the world's largest) with its Giralda Tower (a former minaret). After lunch, continue to explore the city at leisure or indulge in some shopping. In the evening enjoy a Flamenco show. Overnight in Seville.

#### Day 5: Seville - Cordoba - Granada (281 kilometres)

Depart for Cordoba. Visit one of the world's marvels, the former Great Mosque (now a cathedral). Enjoy some free time for lunch on your own. We then continue to Granada, passing thousands of acres of olive groves. In the evening, visit the quaint and typical Albaicin quarter, where Andalusian customs and music create an enchanting atmosphere and enjoy your dinner. Overnight in Granada.

#### Day 6: Granada - Costa del Sol (150 kilometres)

This morning, enjoy an escorted tour of the magnificent Alhambra and the verdant Gardens of the Generalife. We then take you to the world-famous resort area of the Costa del Sol. Overnight at Costa del Sol.

#### Day 7: Costa del Sol

The day is at leisure to enjoy this vacationer's paradise. Overnight at Costa del Sol.

#### Day 8: Costa del Sol - Madrid (550 kilometres)

Transfer to the rail station to take the fast train AVE to Madrid in Tourist Class. Arrive in Madrid and transfer to your hotel. Overnight in Madrid.

#### Day 9: Madrid

Transfer to the airport for your departure flight. You also have the option of extending your stay.

Total distance: 1,517 kilometres.

The then insignificant Castilian town of Madrid, set on a high plateau close to the geographical centre of the country and ringed by mountains, was changed forever when it was chosen by King Felipe II as his capital nearly 450 years ago, leading it to become the hub of Spain's mighty empire. Today, the legacy of its wealth and power may be seen in the splendid buildings, astonishing art galleries and stupendous museums that dot the city.

But modern Madrileños, whilst proud of their distinguished history, have much more to enjoy - a dynamic nightlife, a burgeoning flamenco and jazz scene, countless fine restaurants and tapas bars, the retro hedonism to be found in Malasaña and shopping for Loewe's latest creations in Salamanca.

Places of interest: The 'Golden Triangle' of art museums - Prado, Reina Sofía and Thyssen-Bornomisza around the Paseo del Prado at the heart of Bourbon Madrid; Puerta del Sol, Calle Mayor and Plaza Mayor, the centre of Old Madrid, evoking the splendour of Spain's 17th-century Golden Age; the lovely Jardín Botánico and beautifully landscaped Parque del Buen Retiro; the Plaza de Oriente, overlooked by the Royal Palace and Teatro Royal.

For the family: Faunia Madrid, a huge natural park with thousands of different animals from all over the world: Xanadu Snow Park, not just a place to visit, ski and snowboard, but one of Europe's largest shopping centres, which also includes a cinema, go-karting, mini-golf and ten-pin bowling. Enjoy fantastic views of the city from the Teleferico, an aerial cable car; and, for football fans, take a guided tour of the Real Madrid Santiago Bernabéu Stadium, where you can walk down the players' tunnel, stand in the Presidential box and even visit the dressing rooms.

Best buys: Designer wear, jewellery, antiques, handicrafts, paintings, furniture and ceramics. The prime shopping districts are located around



the main squares in the old town and along the Calle de Serrano in Salamanca. Bargain hunters should head for the Rastro, Madrid's famous flea market on Ribera de Curtidores. El Corte Inglés, Spain's largest department store is on Calle de Preciados. The main areas for antiques are Salamanca and the arcades on Calle Ribera de Curtidores -Nuevas Galerías at number 12 and Galerías Piquer at number 29.

Out and about: Museo del Prado, perhaps Europe's greatest art gallery with some 4,000 works from the 12th to 19th centuries; Museo Thyssen-Bornemisza, containing over 800 paintings, sculptures, carvings and tapestries, ranging from primitive Flemish works to contemporary pieces; the 2,800 room Palacio Real (Royal Palace), with the splendidly frescoed Hall of Halberdiers and Hall of Columns, the Throne Boom's 17th-century sculptures and the lavish private apartments of Charles II; Plaza Mayor, a beautifully-proportioned cobbled square lined with shops and cafés in covered arcades; Chueca, Madrid's trendy Bohemian district.

## Toledo & El Escorial tour Full-day coach excursion from Madrid



Just 70 kilometres south of the capital, spectacularly situated atop a hill above a bend in the River Tagus, ancient **Toledo** possesses an air of graceful, elegant charm. The city, Spain's mediaeval capital and a treasure trove of El Greco artworks, is now a National Monument and a World Heritage site. Behind the old city walls, the narrow, cobbled streets and steep alleyways house a deep architectural and cultural heritage – Romans built a fortress here 2,000 years ago, in the 6th century Visigoths made Toledo their capital and in the Middle

Ages the city was a melting pot for Muslims, Christians and Jews, producing a harmonious fusion of Islamic, Gothic and Hebrew influences.

Our comprehensive tour will reveal the treasures of this endlessly intriguing city, including the **Plaza del Ayuntamiento**, bordered by the magnificent Gothic cathedral, the **Palacio Arzobispal** (Archbishop's Palace) and the 17th century **City Hall** with its two handsome corner




towers and a beautiful tiled frieze by El Greco's son Jorge Manuel Theotocopouli; a walk through the Old Jewish Quarter; the church of Santo Tomé housing El Greco's masterpiece 'The Burial of Count Orgaz'; the Sinagoga de Santa Maria la Blanca, the oldest and largest of the city's original synagogues which was converted to a church some 600 years ago. The Victorio Macho Museum. located on a rocky promontory overlooking the Tagus, where visitors can see



many of the sculptor's works as well as enjoying splendid views of Toledo; the 16th century Franciscan monastery of **San Juan de los Reyes**, an extraordinary fusion of Gothic, Spanish and Flemish styles; and a visit to a **Damasquino** workshop, a craft originating in Damascus and brought to Spain by the Moors, in which gold and steel are united in complex patterns to produce this unique jewellery.

Your journey then takes you to **EI Escorial**, a huge, grandiose testament to the wealth and power of the Spanish empire. Built on the instructions of Philip II over 450 years ago, it is one of the most eccentric structures in all Europe, uniquely combining the functions of a palace, monastery, church and pantheon. Even in a country which has always built its cathedrals and palaces in extravagant styles, EI Escorial is in a class of its own. Your tour of this monumental building includes visits to the **Royal Palace**, **Royal Pantheons**, **Infantes Pantheons**, **Chapter House** and **Basilica**.

The tour operates daily except Mondays, lasts for approximately 11 hours and includes the services of an English-speaking guide.

### Half-day coach excursion in Madrid

This introduction to the fascinating Spanish capital will show you many of the city's highlights including **Buen Retiro Park**, founded in 1631 containing sculptures, monuments, galleries and a peaceful lake; the **Theatre Royal Opera House**, built in 1850 and fully restored in 1997; **Prado Museum**, one of the world's greatest art galleries, housing magnificent collections of paintings by Velázquez and Goya, whose statues stand by the main



entrance; **The National Library**, founded in 1712 and now housed in an enormous 19th century neo-classical building near the **Plaza de Colon**, containing over five million pieces of literature; **Centro de Arte Reina Sofia**, an outstanding museum of 20th century art (including Guernica, Picasso's testament to the horrors of the Civil War); **Thyssen-Bornemisza Museum**, located in the 18th century Villa Hermosa Palace, with major works by Titian, Rubens, Picasso, Van Gogh and Goya; and the vast, lavish 18th century **Royal Palace**, one of the most beautiful and exuberantly decorated in Europe, built by Spain's first Bourbon kings on a high bluff above the River Manzanares. The tour includes visits to the official reception rooms, royal chapel and the private rooms of King Carlos III and Isabel II. The palace was occupied by the royal family until the abdication of Alfonso XIII in 1931, the present king uses it only for state occasions.

The tour operates daily, lasts for four hours, includes the services of an English-speaking guide and entrance fees.

# Ávila & Segovia Full-day coach excursion from Madrid

This full-day tour takes you north-west from Madrid through the mountains of the **Sierra de Guadarrama** to **Ávila de los Caballeros** (of the Knights), 1,130 metres above sea level. The centre of the city is completely encircled by two kilometre long 11th century walls (the best preserved in all of Europe), punctuated by 88 towers and nine gateways.


We stop at **Cerro de Los Cuatro Postes**, from where you get one of the best views of the walls and city, before seeing the 12th century fortified cathedral and visiting the **Basilica de San Vincente** (Ávila's most important Romanesque church with its ornamental belfry) and the **Convento de Santa Teresa**, built on the site of her home. If you are fortunate, you may see groups of *tunas* – students dressed in traditional costume walking the streets while singing songs and playing guitars.

Your journey of discovery then takes you to **Segovia**, the most spectacularly sited city in Spain. The **old town** is set on a rocky hill high above the surrounding rivers. The towers and crenellations of the **Alcázar** (once the summer residence of the royal family in days gone by) rise steep from the crags and the domes and spires of the massive cathedral (the



last Gothic cathedral to have been built in Spain) pierce the skyline – an impressive sight at any time of day and absolutely magical at sunset. No less imposing is the 728 metre long, 29 metre high **aqueduct**, built by the Romans some 2,000 years ago and in use until the late 19th century.

The tour operates from Tuesdays to Sundays, lasts for nine hours, includes the services of an English-speaking guide and entrance fees.

Antiques, porcelain, art, furniture, books and crafts are also good buys. Street markets provide bargains as well as lively entertainment.



Out and about: Opportunities to enjoy theatrical performances, concerts and Flamenco shows abound. Restaurants are plentiful, many featuring fresh, high-quality seafood, meat, poultry and game in rich sauces that are typical of Catalunya. Tapas bars are deservedly popular and a vibrant nightlife can be found in the city's wide range of clubs, discos and bars. Port Aventura Theme Park offers a range of exciting rides, whilst Illa Fantasia Water Park has over 20 different water slides and three large swimming pools.

# Barcelona city tour Half-day coach excursion in Barcelona

This tour provides a fascinating introduction to some of **Barcelona's** most outstanding art and architecture. Your first visit is to **Güell Park**, a UNESCO World Heritage site, designed by **Gaudi**. Here the influence of natural shapes on the architect's work is exemplified by walkways supported by twisting rock pillars that seem to be growing out of the ground, amazing stone structures and vibrant multi-coloured tiled plazas from which there are

magnificent views of the city. The tour continues to Gaudi's exuberant **Sagrada Familia Cathedral**; the Monumental Bullring, combining Moorish and Byzantine architectural styles; and the **Picasso Museum**, housing some 700 works by the famed painter and sculptor.

At the **Paseo de Gracia**, one of Barcelona's grandest boulevards, you can see modernist and Art-Nouveau buildings, including the **Casa Milà** (nicknamed La Pedrera - The Stone Quarry - a building with no straight lines at all), **Lleó Morera, Ametller** and **Batlló** houses, before returning along Calle Balmes.

The tour operates daily in the afternoon, lasts for three and a half hours and includes the services of an English-speaking guide.

Please note that the Picasso Museum is closed on Sundays and Mondays. On these days the tour includes visits to either Santa Maria del Mar, a 14th-century church considered to be the finest example of Catalan Gothic architecture anywhere, or the Parc de la Ciutadella which contains a zoo, lake, splendid fountain and several museums.




